Alone as a refugee by boat – Khalil Kamali's Story

Alumnus Khalil Kamali (2016-2022) was supported by a Burgmann Bursary throughout his college years.

"My parents are originally from Afghanistan and sought refuge by moving to Pakistan in the early 1990s due to the war. I was born in Pakistan with limited opportunities to access education and dropped out of school at a young age to work full-time in a retail shop.



My family members were injured in one of the bomb blasts. In 2011, due to the dangerous situation, I decided to come to Australia alone as a refugee by boat."

Love at first sight – Rebecca Hossack's Story

The Director of two galleries in central London and Miami, alumna Rebecca Hossack (1976– 1977) fell in love with Burgmann College at first sight. Rebecca recently shared her recollections of Burgmann College and how she came to open her first gallery in London.

"In 1988 I rode my bicycle down a little street in Fitzrovia, in Central London, and saw shop with a sign 'For Rent'. Because it was such a lovely day, and people were sitting at tables, outside the Greek restaurants on Charlotte Street, it reminded me of Burgmann and how we all used to sit outside and have our lunch. I saw a man hosing the pavement outside the shop and asked him if he knew anything about it. He turned out to be the landlord. And almost before I knew it, I had signed a twenty-year-lease - and decided to open a gallery."



In Robin's words, "It's an unusual person who doesn't think now and then about the value of their life. In this 21st century CE, we are

living in the very early billions of all potential human lives. Scottish philosopher William MacAskill's recent book "What we owe the future" suggests that we should measure the value of our lives in terms of "debt" to those to follow us. That's not to say we should not devote energy to the well-being of those we are living with here and now and indeed our own. But we should spend some of our energy planting trees under whose shade we shall never sit."
