Remembering Richard Cook, first BRA President

In 1971, Richard Cook was the first elected President of the Burgmann Residents' Association. Little did we know what an indelible mark one person would come to leave on our community. Richard's values of egalitarianism and inclusiveness are woven throughout the Burgmann spirit and Richard was responsible for establishing many of the College's most defining elements and traditions; many of which are still proudly celebrated today. Richard sadly died unexpectedly in December 2019. The Burgmann College community holds Richard's family in our thoughts, in particular his wife Juliet, and Richard's children, Alice, Jeremy, Lizzy, William and Annabel. 1949 - 2019 First elected BRA President, 1971.

In 2018, Richard kindly agreed to be interviewed on his thoughts on the College.

Richard was larger than life, he filled the room, had a great brain, cared about others, he was enthusiastic, gave you hope, made you laugh, sometimes made you squirm and shake your head, was often a shambolic dresser, but always made you smile.
