Alumni & Friends in the News

Burgmann Residential Fellow Lara Nicholls presents 'Women of Empire' at the ANU School of Art and Design

Lara Nicholls, Burgmann Residential Fellow and ANU PhD candidate, presented her final 'viva voce' to the academic faculty and students of the Centre for Art History and Art Theory leading up to the submission of her final thesis in November. Titled Women in the Imperial Art World: Anglo-Australian women artists and their transnational careers, 1885–1907, her thesis presents new research which challenges historical perceptions of women artists in late nineteenth-century Britain and Australia.

British art critic John Ruskin and Australian art historian Bernard Smith suggested women lacked prominence in the art world.
However, Nicholls argues that British-Australian women artists were more visible and influential than traditionally documented. By analysing exhibition data and contextual evidence, she revealed that these artists not only created significant works but also competed alongside their male peers in the imperial art world, highlighting their vital roles as global art citizens.

Honorary lecture held at the ANU featuring alumnus and agriculture visionary Dr John C. Mitchell OAM

Burgmann College alumnus Dr John C. Mitchell OAM (1975–1978) has played an integral part in the research of ANU Economics Professor Bruce Chapman and Ecology Professor David Lindenmayer, who are working together to develop sustainable agricultural farming practices for Australia's future. The inaugural John Mitchell lecture was held at the ANU Research School of Economics on 26 August.

In this honorary lecture, Professor Bruce Chapman and Professor David Lindenmayer [presented] their joint work involving the use of revenue-contingent government loans to finance a diverse range of rural investments, including for projects involving sustainable environmental activities, land restoration, and the protection of threatened species. Their analysis [illustrated] that it is feasible and desirable for governments to be involved in a range of propitious agricultural activities, with minimal cost to the public sector.'


