Introducing Evelyn Tilley, inaugural Harriet Nixon Scholar

After a heartwarming show of support from you, our Burgmann community, we have raised \$160,000 to establish The Harriet Nixon Scholarship. It is with great pleasure and pride we welcome Evelyn 'Evie' Tilley, our inaugural Harriet Nixion Scholar.

Having spent most of her life on a farm in Booborowie, South Australia, Evie helped her family—mum Kirsty, dad Leith, and younger brothers John and Patrick—shear and slaughter sheep, alongside growing crops like wheat, barley and canola. She dreamed of working in the public service, and knew the natural progression of pursuing her dream would ultimately lead her to Canberra.

On coming to Burgmann, Evie says it felt like she 'was meant to be here'.

'In the beginning of Year 12, I stayed in Burgmann College for a week for the

National Youth Science Forum, and I had the most amazing time. I loved the campus, I loved the Dining Hall and the decorations on the walls—it just felt like a great environment. So, when my family found ourselves in Canberra over the winter holidays, I went back to Burgmann for a tour. I had Burgmann's then O-Week Chair and current 2025 BRA President Charley Ellwood as my tour guide, and it turned out that of the hundreds of rooms in the College, he was in the exact same room I had stayed in earlier in the year. Topping off the experience, I was able to meet all the staff at morning tea, and I had one of the best muffins I had ever had.

'To me, Burgmann just fell into place, and I am so grateful that I made the decision to apply, because it has been one of the best experiences.' From stock broker to seascape painter: Julian Twigg's creative evolution

Alum Julian Twigg (1984–1986) is remembered at Burgmann for his integral role in creating Dawborn, and is now recognised as an accomplished Australian visual artist. Julian's work, including select originals featuring Canberra and Burgmann College, will be exhibited at our 2025 Back-to-Burg Alumni & Friends Weekend.

Julian Twigg (1984–1986) is a celebrated visual artist whose works are held in public and private collections; a painter, ceramicist, and printmaker represented by **Australian Galleries** with numerous solo exhibitions, artist residencies, and art awards to his name.

Julian began his artistic career later in life. His mother was an artist and often gifted him sketchbooks whilst growing up, but Julian says his interest in art didn't begin to emerge until his university days, converging with the creation of one of Burgmann's beloved traditions: the Daw-born Cup, later known simply as Dawborn.

Julian grew up in Melbourne and was accepted into the Australian National University to study Economics. He followed a few of his Melbourne schoolmates to Burgmann College, and while he says he initially kept to his old crowd, as those schoolmates began to graduate, Julian began to establish new friends and connections at Burgmann College.

One of his new Burgmann friends was Patrick Southey (1982–1984), with whom Julian frequently played pool in the A.R. Main Room. Together with others, they created a constitution and a committee for a College pool competition they christened 'The Daw-born Cup'.

Starting out at RMIT, we had to choose a subject, so because I had a view of the sea, I chose the ships coming in and out of the Port of Melbourne. It went from there and has stayed with me ever since.

Ashoor Khan's career leads him to community development work in remote Australian regions

After leaving Burgmann College, alum Ashoor Khan (2007–2009) has forged a professional path centred around social development, policy and law, and has rejoined our Burgmann community as Treasurer of the BCAA.

'It has been quite a journey since finishing up at Burgmann College in 2009 as a Hawker Scholar. Plenty of up and downs, but I must say that I have learned more from periods of adversity along the way, rather than success. During my time at University, I was able to experience College life, while also doing internships for mid/large professional services firms and some federal government agencies. I finished up with a Bachelor of Commerce (Accounting) and Bachelor of Laws and did the typical "corporate thing", which was a graduate program for a large multi-national in Sydney.

'Big city working life was not my cup of tea. So, I spent some time with family in Australia, went back to South America, toured the United States and Canada (where I caught up with a Burgmann alum). Then went off to Ireland, Europe and the Middle East. It was a wonderful trip, but I realised that I had to find a "new normal". Travelling without any real purpose can be fun, but it's not sustainable over the longer-term.

'I had previously done an internship with a Community Legal Centre outside of Sydney and that was a good reminder about what I was really passionate about: social and community development...'

Burgmann alum Daniel Sloper PSM (1989–1990) has been appointed as Australia's next High Commissioner to New Zealand.

Mr Sloper is a senior career officer with the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade and was most recently First Assistant Secretary, East Asia Division.

From the press release from the **Minister of Foreign Affairs website**:

'Mr Sloper's previous roles include First Assistant Secretary of the Pacific Division, where he led work on relations with New Zealand, and Australia's G20 Special Representative.

'He has served overseas as Australia's Special Representative on Afghanistan (based in Doha), as Deputy Head of Mission in Berlin, and in Tokyo.'

Daniel served as a BRA Whip during his time at Burgmann College, was on the O-Week Committee, and was also active in basketball, Dawborn, Inward Bound, soccer, and WOBCO.

Dr John C. Mitchell OAM makes generous pledge to support the Burgmann College Endowment Fund

In January, alum Dr John C. Mitchell OAM (1975–1978) pledged an annual recurring gift of \$50,000 towards the Burgmann College Endowment Fund, beginning in 2026.

The College is establishing the Burgmann College Endowment Fund to help us face future challenges and keep our founders' vision alive for generations of residents.

Dr Mitchell, a dedicated and considered supporter of Burgmann College, is a highly regarded economist and generous philanthropist who believes in the power of education to alleviate poverty. He recently funded the transformation of the Mortlock Corridor and Flat 2 into a 10-room facility with access to

a private courtyard, which improved the social cohesion of the area and provided a new bathroom, laundry and kitchen facilities.

Dr Mitchell has also pledged a \$250,000 gift in his Will toward the Burgmann College Endowment Fund. He hopes that his leadership in giving inspires other alumni to support the College as they are able.


