The Burgmann Alumni & Friends Mentoring Program aims to connect Burgmann residents with mentors from our esteemed Alumni and Friends Community who share their field of interest.

Through this unique initiative, mentors inspire and guide the next generation of professionals, providing invaluable insights into future career options and opportunities, and assisting with their movement into their chosen professional field.

The BAM program currently pairs around 100 alumni mentors with Burgmann residents, across a variety of disciplines, with the program taking place in the second semester of each year.

Individual residents are introduced to their mentors via email and are encouraged to contact their mentor with a view to participating in two informal meetings or skype sessions between August and November within the same year. Additionally, the College hosts an annual mentor/mentee networking event.

BAM is one of the many ways our alumni and friends give back to the College and support the next generation of Burgmann residents. It's always nice to see when a connection turns into a career opportunity and seeing Alumni and residents sharing stories about their time at College.


